THE UNITED STATES COAST GUARD

United States Coast Guard (USCG), <u>military service</u> within the U.S. armed forces that is charged with the enforcement of <u>maritime</u> laws. It consists of approximately 35,000 officers and enlisted personnel, in addition to civilians. It is under the jurisdiction of the Department of Homeland Security. In time of war, it functions as part of the U.S. Navy and is under the direction of the president.

The USCG was established in 1790 by Secretary of the Treasury <u>Alexander Hamilton</u> as the Revenue Marine Service. It later became the Revenue Cutter Service and, in 1915, was combined with the U.S. Lifesaving Service (formed 1878) to become the Coast Guard. It was under the (peacetime) jurisdiction of the <u>Treasury Department</u> until 1967, when it was transferred to the Department of Transportation. In 2003 the Coast Guard was placed under the jurisdiction of the newly created <u>Department</u> of Homeland Security.]

The Coast Guard enforces all applicable federal laws on the high seas and waters within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States. It administers laws and promulgates and enforces regulations for the promotion of safety of life and property along the entire U.S. coast, including Alaska and Hawaii. It develops and operates aids to navigation in order to maintain the safety of ports and vessels in U.S. territorial waters.

The peacetime duties of the Coast Guard involve the inspection of vessels and their equipment and the direction and operation of lighthouses, lightships, buoys, and such electronic navigational aids as loran (long-range navigation) stations and radio beacons. The Coast Guard maintains an extensive network of lifeboat and search-and-rescue stations using surface vessels and aircraft. It also operates the International Ice Patrol, which maintains surveillance of icebergs in the North Atlantic shipping lanes. The USCG also gathers data for the National Weather Service and assists distressed ships and planes. Wartime duties include escorting ships, securing ports, and manning transports. The Coast Guard also assists in the interdiction of illegal narcotics that enter the United States on or over coastal waters.

The Coast Guard's organization parallels that of the U.S. Navy, and Coast Guard ranks and ratings are identical to those of the Navy. The two services' uniforms are also similar. The USCG is headed by a Coast Guard admiral who is appointed by the president. Coast Guard Reserve was established in 1939. Women have been permitted to serve in the regular Coast Guard since 1973. The U.S. Coast Guard Academy is located in New London, Connecticut.






10 Fun Christmas Factsl

- Robert L. May, a copywriter for Montgomery Ward, is credited with inventing Rudolph the red-nosed reindeer in 1939. Instead of Rudolph, he almost named him Reginald or Rollo.
- 2. Each year more than 3 billion Christmas cards are sent in the U.S. alone.
- Holiday spending in America will reach roughly 1 trillion dollars, including over 1 billion dollars spent on real Christmas trees, 2 billion spent on fake trees, and 6 billion in total on decorations!
- Washington Irving, the famous writer and creator of the Headless Horseman, had a dream where St. Nicholas flew across the sky in a wagon. Santa's sleigh has been flying ever since.
- 5. Millions of children write letters to Santa Claus each year, with letters piling up in Post Offices everywhere with no real destination. In 1982, the Canadian Post Office created a solution by designating a special zip code specifically for Santa: HOH OHO. Approximately 1 million pieces of mail bearing that code are received by Canada Post each year, and all are answered, each in the language or form in which it was written.
- Online shopping has propelled delivery numbers to unbelievable heights. USPS expects to deliver up to 28 million packages a day this holiday season.
- Irving Berlin, the famous American composer wrote the song, "White Christmas". Bing Crosby's 1942 version of the song is the best-selling single of all time world-wide!
- In 1980, the highest selling Christmas toy was the Rubik's Cube, priced at \$1.99.
- The song Jingle Bells was written by James Lord Pierpont in 1857. It was originally intended for the Thanksgiving season. Astronauts Walter Schirra Jr. and Thomas Stafford played their own rendition of the song to mission control while aboard Gemini VI. Using a harmonica and sleigh bells, Jingle Bells became the first song to be broadcast from outer space.
- 10. NORAD's "Santa Tracker" was born from a misprint in a newspaper. In 1955, a Sears ad displayed a number that children could call to tell Santa what they wanted for Christmas. In error, they printed the hotline to the Director of Operations for the U.S. Continental Air Defense. Remarkably, Colonel Harry Shoup ordered his staff to give the children updates on the flight coordinates of Santa.
